## From the Pastor:

At this time when our students are graduating from High Schools and colleges, I thought that I give them some tips toward climbing the ladder of achievement in their pursuit for further studies and skills improvement.

**Set a goal and define it:** To accomplish anything, you need to set a goal. Ask yourself, what you want to BE? What you want to DO? What you want to HAVE? What you want to GIVE? In order to give a shape to your goal, positively write it down. When you write down, it becomes like a set of instructions for your unconscious mind to carry out. The written goals will create a road map to success and become a force which cannot be easily stopped. Make sure your goal is SMART, that is Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time framed.

**Specific:** It means that you describe in detail what you want to achieve and make it as concrete as possible. For example say, I want to develop computer skills which is vague. But say, I will practice computer typing for one hour every week which is more specific. So provide enough detail so that there is no indecision as to what exactly you should be doing when the time comes to do it. A study of Harvard graduates found that after 20 years, the 3 percent of them who had written goals achieved more financially than the other 97 combined. “An average person with average talent, ambition and education, can outstrip the most brilliant genius in our society, if that person has clear, focused goals” (Brian Tracy)

**Measurable:** Goals need to be measurable. You can tell when you have completed them. Or in other words, you are able to prove to yourself that you were successful and your time was not wasted. For example, I will type 45 words in a minute. Measurement is a way of monitoring your progress.

**Achievable:** By achievable we mean goals need to be reasonable and attainable. They should be challenging but should not be out of reach. Stretching should not lead you to become disheartened.

**Realistic:** Plan to do things which have chances of success. Plan only a few things and be successful rather than many things and be unsuccessful. Success breeds success! So start small, with what you can do and then gradually increase the amount of work.

**Time Framed:** Keep a time frame. Put some sort of deadline to your goals. Goals need to have a time frame. You should set a starting date and finishing date. Having a set amount of time will give your goals a structure. For example, I will complete computer typing two hours each on Fridays and Saturdays in the month of June. Without a time frame, there is no sense of urgency, no reason to take any action today.

**“Crystallize your goals:** Make a plan for achieving them and set yourself a deadline. Then, with supreme confidence, determination and disregard for obstacles and other people’s criticisms carry out your plan”. Paul Meyer

**Thomas Alva Edison** discouraged his friend **Henry Ford** from pursuing his fledgling idea of a motorcar. Convinced of the worthlessness of the project, Edison invited Ford to come and work for him. Thankfully, Ford remained committed to his idea and tirelessly pursued his dream. Although his first attempt resulted in a vehicle without reverse gear, Ford knew he could make it happen and eventually, he did. (Standout among the rest by Norbert Menezes SJ - pp108 – 110)

This exercise can be used in any field and by anybody and it will certainly make you SMART in life. Your success story will become an inspiration for others. In fact this model is based on the strategies that big companies and corporations are using and as a result, today they are controlling the world economy and market. However, as Catholics we adopt this model with prayer component. Along with the pursuit, you should also pray to Jesus and Blessed Mother. Side by side, keep repeating the beautiful phrase that we find in the letter to the Philippians Chapter 4:13 “I can do everything through Christ who strengthens me”.

If anyone so desires to work on the aforesaid model, I would be most willing to assist.
