OLOS School News: We would like to extend a huge **“Thank You”** to **Diamond Dog Food:** The owners of Diamond Dog Food in Meta, Missouri, gave a **generous donation to Our Lady of the Snows Catholic School, in the amount of \$5,600.** We extend our gratitude to them for their support of our Technology Fund. This grant will be used to assist us with additional technology improvements around the school and church. With this donation and other donations to our Technology Drive this year, we are able to extend our Chromebooks for student use from 8th grade down to the 2nd graders. (The original plan was to go down to 4th grade.) This will be huge for the continued advancement of our academic excellence here at Our Lady of the Snows School. Please, as community members, help us keep the school and church grounds safe. With the start of school, additional dogs (pets) have been noticed around the school grounds. These, at first, were handled by a basic deterrent of telling them to leave and a shooing off. Recently, additional dogs have joined in on this and dogs have been seen fighting amongst each other. This week we received a call saying at drop off, a dog growled at a student with no provocation from the student. This is a huge safety concern and would like to bring it to the community for help. If this problem continues, animal control will be called and expenses will be handled by the pet owners. So, please assist us by spreading the word that dogs roaming the school grounds will not be permitted while school is in session.

From the Pastor: The festival of ‘Halloween’ is getting closer and so I would like to give a little background along with Christian perspective. According to the Encyclopedia Britannica, ‘in ancient Britain and Ireland, the Celtic Festival of Samhain was observed on October 31, at the end of summer.... The souls of the dead were supposed to revisit their homes on this day and the autumnal festival acquired sinister significance, with ghosts, witches, goblins, black cats, fairies and demons of all kinds said to be roaming about. It was the time to placate the supernatural powers controlling the processes of nature. In addition, Halloween was thought to be the most favorable time for divinations concerning marriage, luck, health, and death. It was the only day on which the help of the devil was invoked for such purposes.

Halloween symbols, customs, and practices undoubtedly have had a variety of influences upon Western culture throughout history. However, in early American history, Halloween was not celebrated due to America’s strong Christian heritage. It was not widely observed until the twentieth century. Initially, it was practiced only in small Irish Catholic settlements, until thousands of Irish migrated to America during the great potato famine and brought their customs with them. To some degree, our modern Halloween is an Irish holiday with early origins in the Celtic winter festival. Interestingly, in American culture, the rise in popularity of Halloween also coincides roughly with the national rise in Spiritism that began in 1848’.

The word ‘Halloween’ originated from the greeting **'hallo evening'** addressed to the creatures of evil world. Realizing that it was a pagan festival, the early church countered it with the introduction of the feast of all saints in Rome in 4th and 5th century to be celebrated on November 1st and the feast of all souls on the next day, November 2nd. The type of celebration that we see on Halloween today gives recognition to the evil power and the pagan believes that existed in earlier times. We all know that Jesus defeated the power of evil by His death and Resurrection and by which we have been made children of God and so the evil has no power over us nor have a place in our homes or lives. We are able to see the onslaught of evils forces on the leaders of the church and of the nation. Shops are filled with devilish masks, costumes, skulls, skeletons and so on. It has been very well commercialized. Under these circumstances, we must celebrate the day with Christian perspective and understanding. In the place of evil masks and costumes, I suggest that we encourage our kids dress up like angels or saints or nurses or doctors or priests or nuns or firefighters or persons of any other services to the community, church, and country with the fun of doing trick or treat. In this way we have got to educate and help our kids in a new way of celebrating the day. Hence, I earnestly request all parents to decorate their houses with positive images and provide light color dresses to kids as suggested so that we can collectively create a positive and Christian environment in our homes and neighborhood. This will eventually help the entire family to grow with positive mind and outlook. Now, I request the PSR coordinators and teachers to educate and guide our kids during the class hour highlighting the Christian perspective of the feast and the Christian way of celebrating it with a lot of fun.
